MILDURA SHOW SOCIETY INC. SHOW REGULATIONS

SECTION A-REGULATIONS

General Regulations Governing the Conduct of the Show

Every entry for competition or for exhibition only will be regarded as having been made subject to any and all of the Society's Show regulations, conditions and provisions and every competitor or exhibitor shall be deemed to have made the entry with full knowledge thereof.

Exhibitors and all others concerned are requested to make themselves fully acquainted with the following regulations, and also those applicable only to exhibits in the section or class in which an exhibit is entered, to assist the Society in giving them effect and to ensure satisfactory conduct of the Show.

The Regulations will be strictly adhered to. The Show Society takes all care in the production of this Schedule of Events but accepts no responsibility for omission or errors that may occur.

- 1. Entry fees shall be paid at time of entry. GST has been applied to entries in all sections.
- 2. The closing date for entries see section C Exhibit Information for closing dates.
- 3. All entries are to be made online through Showday Online https://showday.online/show/mildura. No exhibit shall be received without entry fees, on or before the date of closing of entries. The Coordinator shall have power to extend the date of entry in any section.
- The Council of the Society reserves the right of refusing or cancelling any entry without giving reasons for so doing.
- 5. Exhibitors must deliver their exhibits to the allotted position on the Show Grounds on or before the advertised time, with the supplied card, stating the class, section and the exhibit number.
- 6. Exhibit Cards will be issued via email upon entry online.
- 7. Exhibitors must not remove their entries before 10.30 pm. on the final day of the show without permission of the Head Steward except where otherwise specified in the schedule.
- 8. Exhibitors of cattle and sheep shall provide their forage, including regular removal of waste materials.
- 9. All exhibits must, except if otherwise allowed in the Schedule be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor and all farm and horticultural produce must be the production of an exhibitor exhibiting it, unless stated otherwise. In the event of the exhibitor disposing of an exhibit between the date of entry and the day of the exhibition, he must give notice in writing of the sale, together with the name and address of the purchaser.
- 10. The Society shall not be responsible for any accident or mishap that may be caused through or by an exhibit and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall not hold the Society responsible and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from such accident or mishap.
- 11. The Society shall not under any circumstances be held responsible for any loss or non- delivery of livestock or other exhibits at the Society's exhibition.
- 12. The Society shall not under any circumstances be held responsible for any loss by theft, fire, and storm, damage by water, flood or lightning. The Council advises all

- exhibitors to insure their exhibits against any or all of the foregoing risks.
- 13. The signing of the Certificate of Entry of any animal shall be taken as a guarantee that the animal is free from disease, as far as is known to the owner; in case of infectious disease being spread through or by any exhibit, the exhibitor shall be held responsible.
- 14. Should there be any reason to suspect an exhibit is either diseased or dangerous, the Society reserves the right of refusing admittance to or removing the same from the grounds at the expense of the exhibitor.
- 15. Should any exhibit, having obtained a prize, be disqualified the next on the list does not necessarily obtain a prize. Council of Management with or without the advice of the Judges shall decide the question.
- 16. The Council of Management may withhold any prize when statements have been erroneously or fraudulently made regarding an exhibit and exhibitors guilty of false entry or statements may be debarred from again exhibiting, and if members, will be liable to expulsion from the Society.
- 17. No prize card or ribbon except those won at the current Show shall be permitted to be exhibited on any exhibit.
- 18. The breeding year shall date from 1st August for horses, and for cattle, to date from day of Show.
- 19. All Competitors and Showmen's Dogs must be tied on a short lead, no longer than two metres. No noncompetitive dogs will be permitted at the event.

VAS Ltd. Regulations

- Each exhibit entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
- 2. Professionals are not eligible, which is defined as someone that works professionally or derives the greater percentage of their income in that craft, art form or technique.
- 3. All work to have been completed in the last twelve months prior to its entry at a local Show.
- 4. The competition follows the three levels of competition: Show Level, Group level and State level.
- An Exhibit having won at a Show will compete at a Group Final; the winning exhibit will then compete at the State Final held at the next Royal Melbourne Show.
- An exhibitor having won at Show level is not eligible to enter the VAS Competition at any other Show until after the Group Final judging.
- An exhibitor is only eligible to represent one Group in the State Final.
- If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final levels, the second place getter is eligible to compete.
- 9. An Exhibit having won at a State Final is no longer eligible to compete in the competition.
- 10. If an exhibitor is found to have won more than one Group Final the exhibitor must forfeit/refund all prizes and will be disqualified from exhibiting for twelve months.

SECTION B - PROTESTS & DISQUALIFICATION

- No protest against an exhibit or the decision of the Judge shall be entered unless made in writing and lodged with the Coordinator of the Society before the conclusion of the show. A non- refundable \$25 must accompany each protest and this sum shall be forfeited to the Society if the Committee of the Society considers such protest frivolous.
- 2. Protests can only be lodged by exhibitors who have competed in that particular section.
- 3. The Society may, according to its discretion, fine an exhibitor to an amount not exceeding \$50 for infringement of Rules, offensive behaviour or corrupt practices, or may disqualify an exhibit or exhibitor for such a term or period as is considered necessary to meet the offence.
- 4. Where any person, the exhibitor or exhibit is fined or disqualified at any Show of any Society, the Coordinator of the Society shall report the matter to the Coordinator of the Victorian Agricultural Societies Association and the Northern District Agricultural Societies who shall forthwith notify all affiliated Societies thereof, and thereupon, disqualification shall be enforced at all Shows of the affiliated Societies. Any exhibitor fined by a Society for an offence shall not be permitted to exhibit at an affiliated Society Show while such fine remains unpaid.
- The Council of the Association shall constitute an Appeal Board to take into consideration any appeal against the decision of, or disqualification imposed by an affiliated Society upon any person or exhibitor or exhibit.
- Full particulars regarding appeals are obtainable from Secretaries of all affiliated Societies.
- 7. The name of any defaulter in regard to fees for privileges or like shall be posted by the Society to the Association whereupon the Coordinator of the Association shall notify all affiliated Societies. Any such defaulter shall be debarred from exhibiting or obtaining privileges from affiliated Societies until all claims have been fulfilled.

8. SECTION C - PRIZE MONEY & EXHIBIT INFORMATION

- 9. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to provide bank account details to enable the payment of prize money electronically.
- 10. Prize money will be available to be paid up till and including the 30th November of the year in which the prize money has been won.
- 11. The Council of Management retains the right to withhold all or any portion of the prize money not paid by the due date if it desires to do so.
- 12. All perishable exhibits not claimed by noon on Monday after Show week may be disposed of by the Society.
- 13. Should the Society postpone, alter or cancel the Show, no refund of entry money will be made, but will be retained as a donation to the Society's funds.
- 14. Regulations applicable only to exhibits or exhibitors in which they are exhibited. Regulations governing exhibits are published in the Prize Schedule. The online Entry Form, Catalogue of Exhibits or any official publication of the Society shall be deemed as part of the Society's Show Regulations.

15. Where the Mildura Show Society deems there to be insufficient entries in an event, the Mildura Show Society, reserves the right to alter the prizes awarded.

SECTION D - STEWARDS

- Stewards must be in attendance at the Show Grounds at the appointed time to receive the exhibits and are responsible that the exhibits are correctly classed; all exhibits placed in each section together ready for judging, and direct Judges to the exhibit he was appointed to judge.
- 2. Stewards must supply Judges with award book of each respective class and will attend on the Judges to afford any information required but will not say or do anything to influence their decision. They must not reveal the name of the owner of any exhibit or repeat any remarks the judges may make to each other.
- 3. Stewards will obtain prize cards and write the name of the successful exhibits thereon, and affix same on exhibit bearing the entry number of the award book; they will obtain the award book of the Judges when judging is completed and be responsible for delivery to the Coordinator after affixing prize cards.
- 4. No steward who is an exhibitor in his particular class or classes shall remain in attendance while sections in which he is interested are being judged.
- 5. Should the stewards suspect that any exhibit is either diseased or dangerous; the stewards have the right of refusing admittance or removing the exhibit from the grounds at the expense of the exhibitor.

SECTION E - JUDGES

- Judges will receive an award book from the stewards of the class in which they will judge, and will sign award books on each page in each section and deliver same to the stewards.
- 2. No Judge shall be an exhibitor in the class in which he is acting as Judge.

- The Judges may award a second prize instead of a first prize or may withhold a prize altogether where there is only one exhibit or where exhibits are not considered worthy.
- 4. Every Judge shall be instructed to disqualify and notify the Council of Management of the Society of any exhibit they may detect to have been tampered with or improperly dealt with.

SECTION F - LIVESTOCK

- 1. CRUELTY to all animals is forbidden either in the ring or in the paddock or elsewhere.
- An exhibitor found guilty of committing a definite act of cruelty will be disqualified from taking part in all competitions of the Show where the offence was committed.
- 3. The decision rests with a panel which will comprise of the Judge (s), Senior Steward of the Class concerned, the Society's Chief Steward and the Society's Honorary Veterinary Surgeon from which there is no further appeal.
- 4. DOPING It is forbidden to administer any stimulant or depressant to any animal, or to cause to be administered in any way whatsoever either before the start of a competition, or during a competition, or on the previous day, under penalty of the owner's disqualification for life.
- 5. Where an animal has been eliminated for suspected administration of any stimulant or depressant, the Committee shall report the matter to the Council of Management, who will consider within seven (7) days what penalty shall be applied.
- 6. The Committee, as mentioned, shall comprise of the Senior Steward and Judge(s) of the Class concerned, the Society's Chief Steward, and the Society's Honorary Veterinary Surgeon.

SECTION G - RANDOM TESTING FOR DRUGS

The Society may authorize random testing of any animal on the Show Ground.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ALL PERSONS ENTERING ANIMALS AND APPLYING FOR TRADE SPACE

The Victorian Agricultural Societies' Association adopted a new Insurance Scheme at their Annual Convention held at Cobram-Barooga in May 1987 - The Society has implemented these policies from 2003 Show, as laid down by V.A.S.

- 1. Extension for Liability of Animals The Liability of Animals Policy is extended to all owners or people responsible for animals, wishing to participate in Show events. The Policy gives cover from the time that they enter our Show rounds until they leave but does not include transit cover. The cover applies to Horses, Beef & Dairy Cattle, Sheep, Goats, Pigs, Dogs (excluding dogs sanctioned by Dogs Victoria) and Cats.
- Trade Liability All Trades and Tenderers are to include a copy of their current Public Liability Insurance Certificate with their documents.

NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED UNLESS THE APPROPRIATE CHARGES HAVE BEEN INCLUDED WITH YOUR ENTRY FEE

Special Notice to Pavilion Exhibitors

Sections H, I, J, K, L, M, N, NN, O, OA, P, Q, R, RD, S, T, U, V, VS, W, WJ, X, Y and all Junior sections.

All exhibitors in these classes are requested to have their exhibits in place at the times given in each class. Stewards have authority to reclassify exhibits where necessary.

Exhibits must remain available for public inspection for the three days of the Show.

All non-perishable exhibits not collected will be available at the Coordinator's Office, Show Grounds, Monday 23rd October 2023.

All exhibits not collected or arrangements made for their collection with the Senior Stewards will be disposed of in accordance with Show Regulations, Section C4

- Large and perishable exhibits will not be taken to the Coordinator's Office and must be collected at the Show Grounds on the final day of the Show, or on the Sunday morning.
- Exhibits received by mail, rail or any other means of delivery can only be returned through the Coordinator's Office by the means by which they were received, and cannot be collected on the final day of the Show unless appropriate paperwork is produced.

The Australian Young Farmer Challenge (AYFC) is an engaging, entertaining and fast paced competition for young rural people (aged 18-35 years). The AYFC is a demonstration of the talent, skills, techniques and safe work methods that young farmers use every day. Teams compete in a series of skills-based challenges related to farming with a strong emphasis on technique and safety. Competitors are asked to do their best to complete the challenges correctly against the clock, as well to focus on safety, and most importantly, enjoy the competition and provide entertainment to the audience.

Currently VAS Ltd is working with the RASV to develop the Young Farmers Challenge in Victoria with the State Final being held at the Royal Melbourne Show each year.

Rules & Regulations

1. Eligible Teams

- a. Consist of four (4) Competitors
- **b.** Have both male and female competitors. All female or all male teams are not eligible to enter.
- **c.** Have Competitors with minimum skills required depending on the competition activities such as:
- i. Hold a current drivers licence recognised by an Australian State or Territory.
- **ii.** Be capable of hitching a trailer to a car and backing the trailer.
- iii. Be competent at driving a tractor.
- iv. Have experience in driving an all-terrain vehicle (ATV).
- v. Be experienced in using a chainsaw.
- **vi.** Be competent at handling livestock, including horses, sheep and cattle.

2. Eligible Competitors

- **a.** Have Competitors aged between 18 and 35 years of age on the day the National AYFC takes place. Competitors may be required to provide proof of age.
- b. Competitors must reside in the State they are representing for the National YFC Competition or be within 50km of their State's border.
- c. Compete at their own risk.
- **d.** Undertake all Competition activities in a safe manner.
- e. Wear appropriate clothing to compete.

3. Competition Guidelines

- a. The challenge must have at least 6 competitions.
- **b.** The winning Team will be the Team that completes all the challenges correctly, in a safe manner and in the fastest time.

- **c.** Each Team will have a dedicated judge that watches each challenge of the Competition. The Judge will determine when the Team is permitted to move onto the next challenge. The Judge's decision is final.
- **d.** The Team will be permitted to progress when each challenge has been completed correctly and safely.
- e. The Team must complete every challenge safely and using the correct Personal Protective Equipment (PPE).
- **f.** Any errors made during each challenge will result in the Team having to re-do the challenge to complete it correctly, or receive a time penalty, based on the nature of the challenge.
- g. Teams can incur a time penalty for safety breaches
 h. Teams may be disqualified in the event of a multiple safety breaches and/or dangerous activity affecting
 Competitors, Officials or spectator.

VAS Ltd allows First and Second Placegetters at a Local Show to compete in the next level of the State Final. The competitors must be aged 15 years and under 25 years as of the 1st May in the year of State Final and must reside in Victoria.

The winner of each State Final will be invited to represent Victoria at the Agricultural Shows Australia National Finals. The National Finals are held on a rotation basis, the 2023 National Finals will be held in Tasmania.

Place the mixed fruit, sugar, spice, water and butter in a large saucepan and bring to the boil.

Simmer gently for 3 minutes, then remove from stove, add bicarbonate soda and allow to cool.

Add the sherry, eggs and marmalade, mixing well.

Fold in the sifted dry ingredients then place in a greased and lined 20cm round cake tin.

Bake in a moderately slow oven for 1.5 hours or until cooked when tested.
